

WVHS Campus Issues

Illness at School Students who become ill during the school day must first contact the Attendance Office before leaving or missing class. Failure to do so will constitute an unexcused absence. If a student is on medication, the Health Clerk must be notified. All medications must be left in the Attendance Office.

Injury at School If a student is injured at school, report the injury to the immediate supervisor who will report it to the Attendance Office. If it is necessary for the student to go home, the office will contact the parents. In the case of injury or illness, students are not to leave campus on their own, or stay in the restrooms.

Student Insurance Students have the option of purchasing insurance to cover accidents that occur at school. The school does not provide for this automatically. It must be purchased each year if a student wishes coverage.

Internet Parental permission is required to access the Internet. Use of chat rooms and browsing pornographic web sites is prohibited. Consequences will strictly enforced.

Conflict Management The counseling department has established a program where student conflict managers facilitate discussion between students who have a dispute and help them to find a resolution.

Lockers Lockers are a temporary storage place to keep school issued items, texts, and personal belongings during the day. The locker will be assigned for all four years at West Valley. Do not share your locker or locker combination with anyone. Each student is financially responsible for all issued texts, library books, or any school issued items. Please be reminded that all lockers are school property and may be opened by the administration at any time. West Valley will not be responsible for lost or stolen items.

Cafeteria, Eating Area The Cafeteria and lunch cart will be open during the lunch period, or students may bring their own lunch. Students are required to eat in the lunchroom or designated areas on campus. Students are expected to clean up after themselves and keep the eating areas clean.

Obscenity, Profanity The use of vulgar, obscene or profane language is unacceptable anywhere on campus. Consequences may include disciplinary action and an assigned profanity essay.

Electronic Devices Radios, headphones, pagers, disc players, cellular phones, and tape decks are not to be brought to school unless authorized for a special activity. The item may be confiscated and returned to the student or parent at the end of the day.

Dress Code Students will be allowed to wear shorts throughout the school year. The shorts must be appropriate as determined by administration and staff.

Tops should be in good taste:

- No low cut sides or necks.
- No T-shirts cut into tank tops.
- No tops may be worn which exposes the midriff.

Underclothing must not be exposed.

All spandex, see through, or mesh-type clothing must be covered.

No strapless garments or leotard, swim-type clothing may be worn unless covered by a blouse or shirt.

No hats or caps may be worn in the classroom, office, or Library.

- The bill of the hat must be worn in front.

No shirts, hats, or backpacks may be worn which have references of sex, drugs, profanity, crude, vulgar, or obscene language written on them.

No gang related apparel as determined by the administration, may be worn at any time. Sagging, chains, or colors will not be tolerated.

The dress code guidelines may change if the need arises or as determined by the administration.

Student Government Elected positions include the following: Student Body President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer of each class as well as the Associated Student Body (A.S.B.). The Commissioner of Activities, Commissioner of Athletics, Commissioner of Publicity and 3 student judicial positions which are elected four to six weeks before the end of school. In the fall, the incoming freshman class elects its officials and, as well, each social science class elects its officials to the Student Council. All positions exist for a term of one year except for the student council representatives for the social science classes, whose term is one semester. VOLUNTEER HELP is needed by the student council. Be sure to let your student council representatives know that you would be willing to help as you as you are needed.

Student Body Cards You must carry your identification card at all times on the campus and at school-related events. It must be presented to a school staff member upon their request. Your card is necessary in order for entrance into dances and extra-curricular activities. When you purchase an ASB sticker for \$15.00, it will be attached to your card, allowing you to receive valuable discounts to extra-curricular activities. The \$15.00 collected for your ASB sticker, besides giving you discounts, helps fund and operate all student clubs, the athletic program, dances, and social gatherings. Replacement for a lost or stolen I.D. is \$5.00.
